What's an interactive notebook?

Interactive notebooks are a visually creative way to engage students in the learning and note taking process. Students will use visual graphics and graphic organizers to learn the material in an engaging way. While learning about the topic, students can use their own creativity to color, decorate and manipulate the materials in their notebooks to make the material more interesting and captivating.

How can I use them?


These pages have multiple options for use.

- They can be printed on colored paper, or students can color in the templates.
- They can be glued into an interactive notebook, or be glued onto a separate piece of paper.
- They can be used as a comprehensive unit, or as separate lessons.
- They can be used in individual, small group, or classroom counseling sessions.
- They can be used as stations in group lessons.

PAGE I: WHAT DO EXPECTED & UNEXPECTED BEHAVIORS MEAN?




Objective Of This Page:

 Students will become familiar with the terms "expected" and "unexpected."

How This Page Works:

 To better understand the concept, students will think about what is expected and unexpected at their favorite restaurant. They will respond to the prompts under the flaps.

PAGE 2: HOW BEHAVIORS MAKE ME FEEL




Objective Of This Page:

 Students will identify how behaviors make them feel.

How This Page Works:

- Students will look at different behaviors and think about how it would make them feel.
- They will notice that expected behaviors usually lead to "positive" emotions, and unexpected behaviors usually lead to "negative" emotions.

PAGE 3: WHAT'S EXPECTED? WITH WHOM?




Objective Of This Page:

 Students will understand that what is expected can change depending on who they are around.

How This Page Works:

Kids will look at 3 different groups of people. They will identify behaviors that are expected and unexpected with each group.

PAGE 4: WHAT'S EXPECTED? WHERE?




Objective Of This Page:

 Students will understand that what is expected can change depending on where they are.

How This Page Works:

- Students will look at 10
 behaviors and determine
 whether they are expected at
 home or at school.
- They will place each behavior strip into the correct pocket.

PAGE 5: WHAT'S EXPECTED AT SCHOOL? FLAP BOOK




Objective Of This Page:

PAGE 6: WHAT'S EXPECTED AT SCHOOL? VENN DIAGRAM




Objective Of This Page:

PAGE 7: MY BEHAVIORS AFFECT HOW OTHERS FEEL




Objective Of This Page:

Objective Of This Page:

Kids will consider the
 effects that their behaviors

 and feelings of others.

How This Page Works:

• Kids will look at 4 behaviors. For each one, they will write about how the behavior my cause someone to feel, and how they may view you if you do that behavior.


