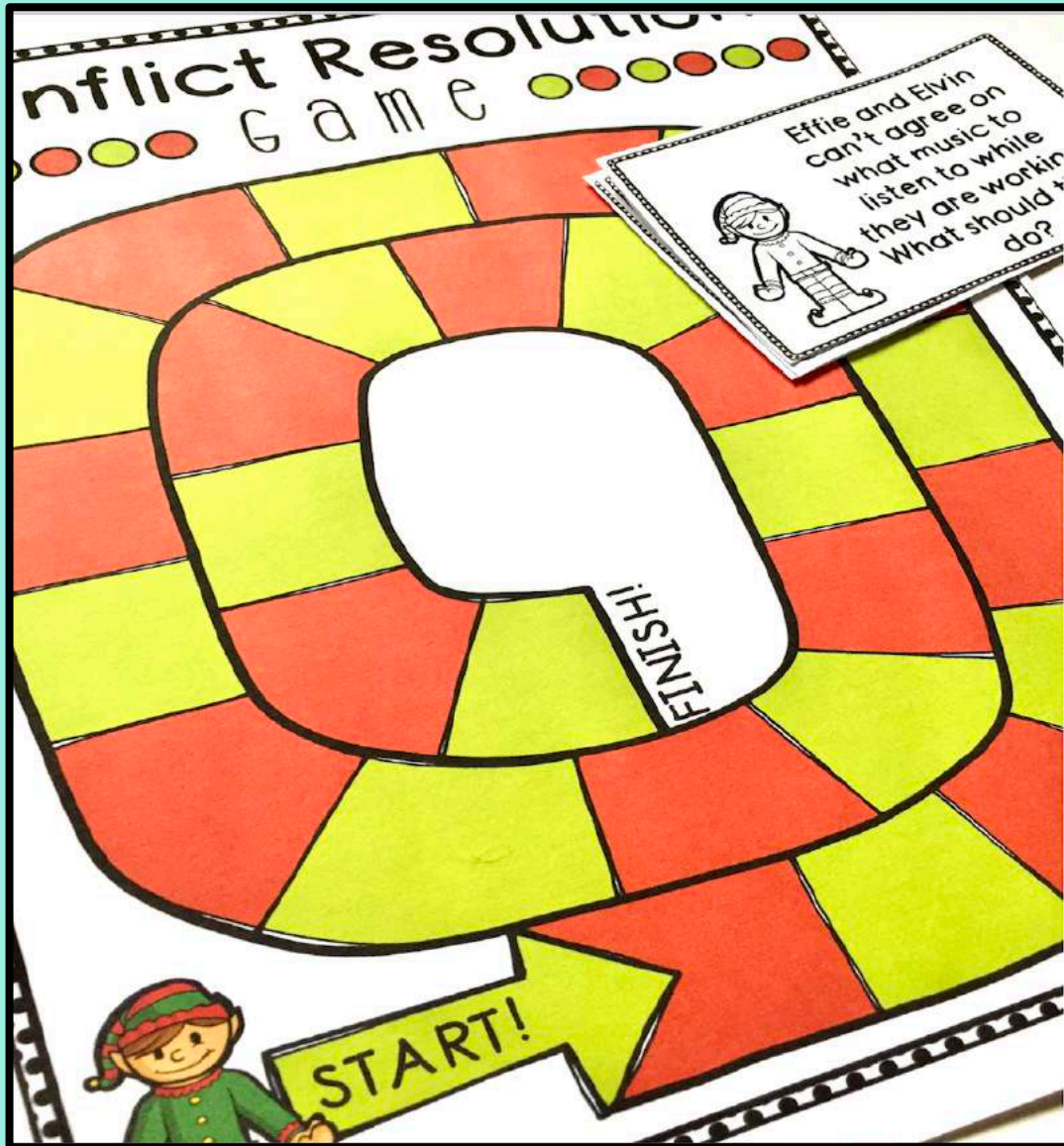


# Use this Christmas themed board game to help your students learn and practice conflict resolution skills!

Uh Oh! You tattled instead of solving your own problem. Move back 2 spaces!



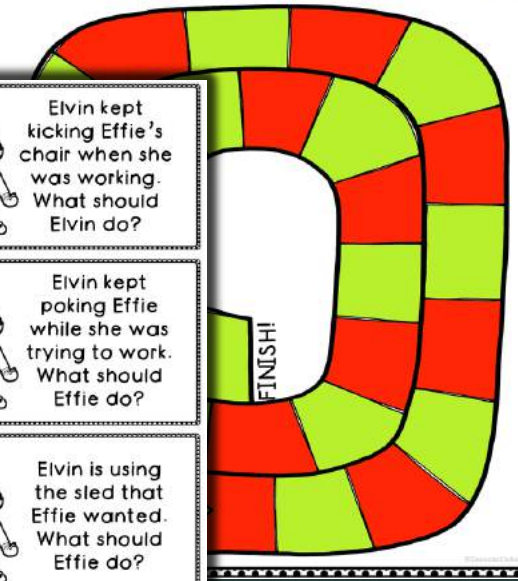
Effie wants to build a snowman, but Elvin wants to bake cookies. What should Effie and Elvin do?
