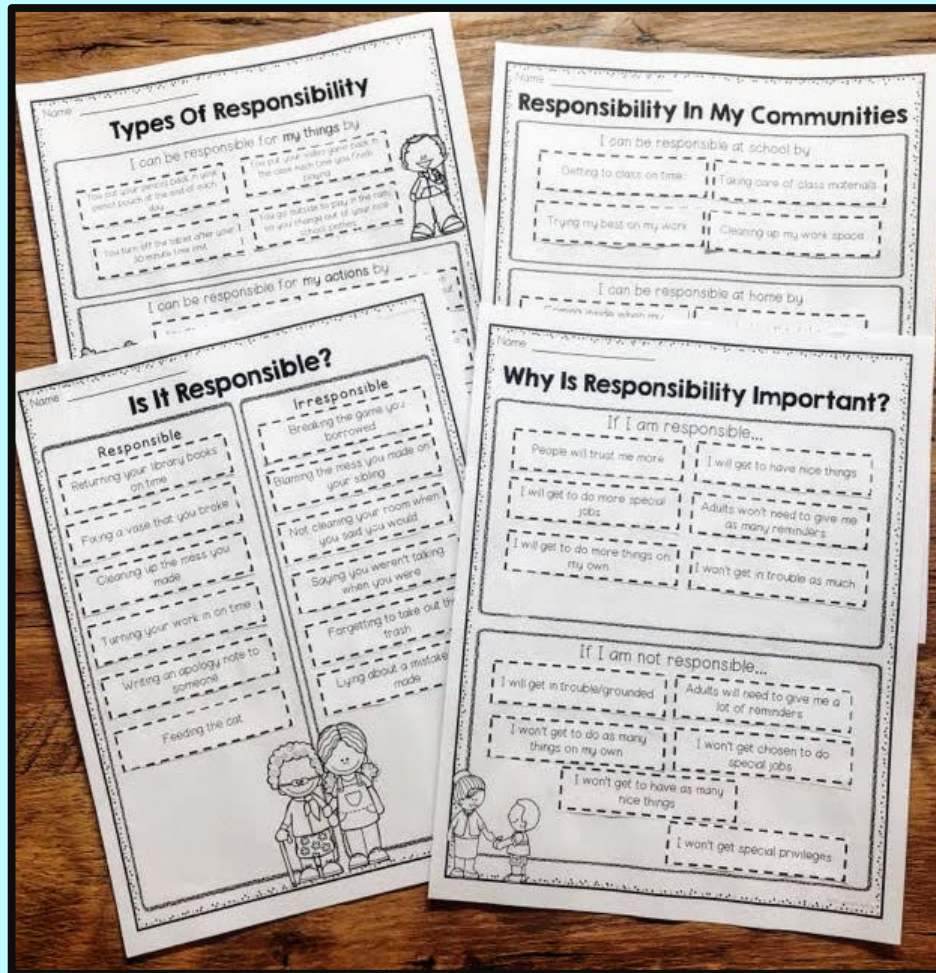


Help your students learn about responsibility with these 4 cut and paste activities!

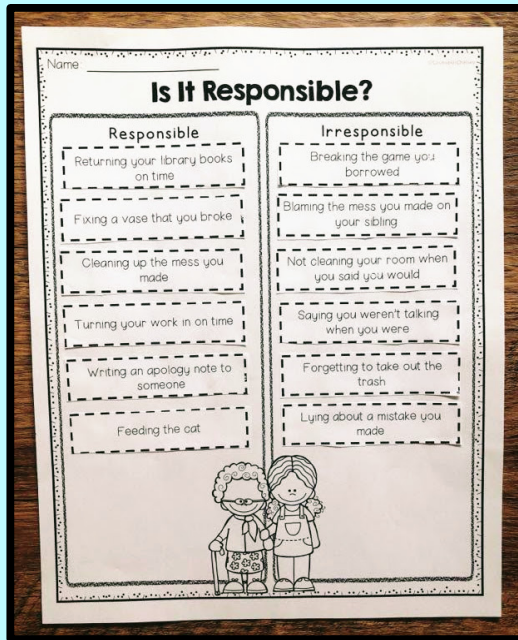


Perfect for:

- Students who could benefit from showing that they are responsible by doing what they say they will!

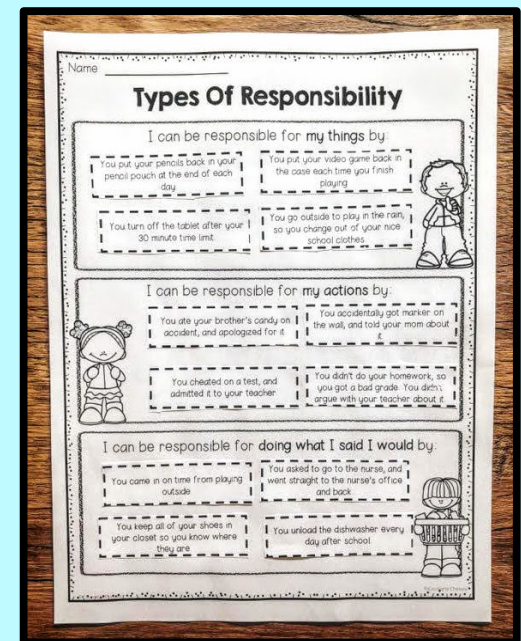
“Is It Responsible?” Cut and Paste

Students will look at 12 actions and decide whether or not they are examples of responsibility.



“Types Of Responsibility” Cut and Paste

Students will learn three types of responsibility – being responsible for their things, being responsible for their actions, and being responsible by doing what they said they would. Students will look at 12 examples and determine which type of responsibility they represent.



“Why Is Responsibility Important?” Cut and Paste

Students will consider the consequences of showing responsible and irresponsible behavior. They will look at 12 examples and decide whether they are consequences of being responsible, or being irresponsible.

Why Is Responsibility Important?

If I am responsible...

People will trust me more	I will get to have nice things
I will get to do more special jobs	Adults won't need to give me as many reminders
I will get to do more things on my own	I won't get in trouble as much

If I am not responsible...

I will get in trouble/grounded	Adults will need to give me a lot of reminders
I won't get to do as many things on my own	I won't get chosen to do special jobs
I won't get to have as many nice things	I won't get special privileges



“Responsibility In My Communities” Cut and Paste

Students will consider how they can show responsibility in multiple settings. Students will look at 12 examples and decide whether it describes a way to show responsibility at school, at home, or in the community.

Picking up my toys and games	Taking care of my games

Picking up trash I see on the ground	Helping take care of someone who is sick
Staying in the crosswalk when crossing the street	Wearing my helmet when riding a bike
