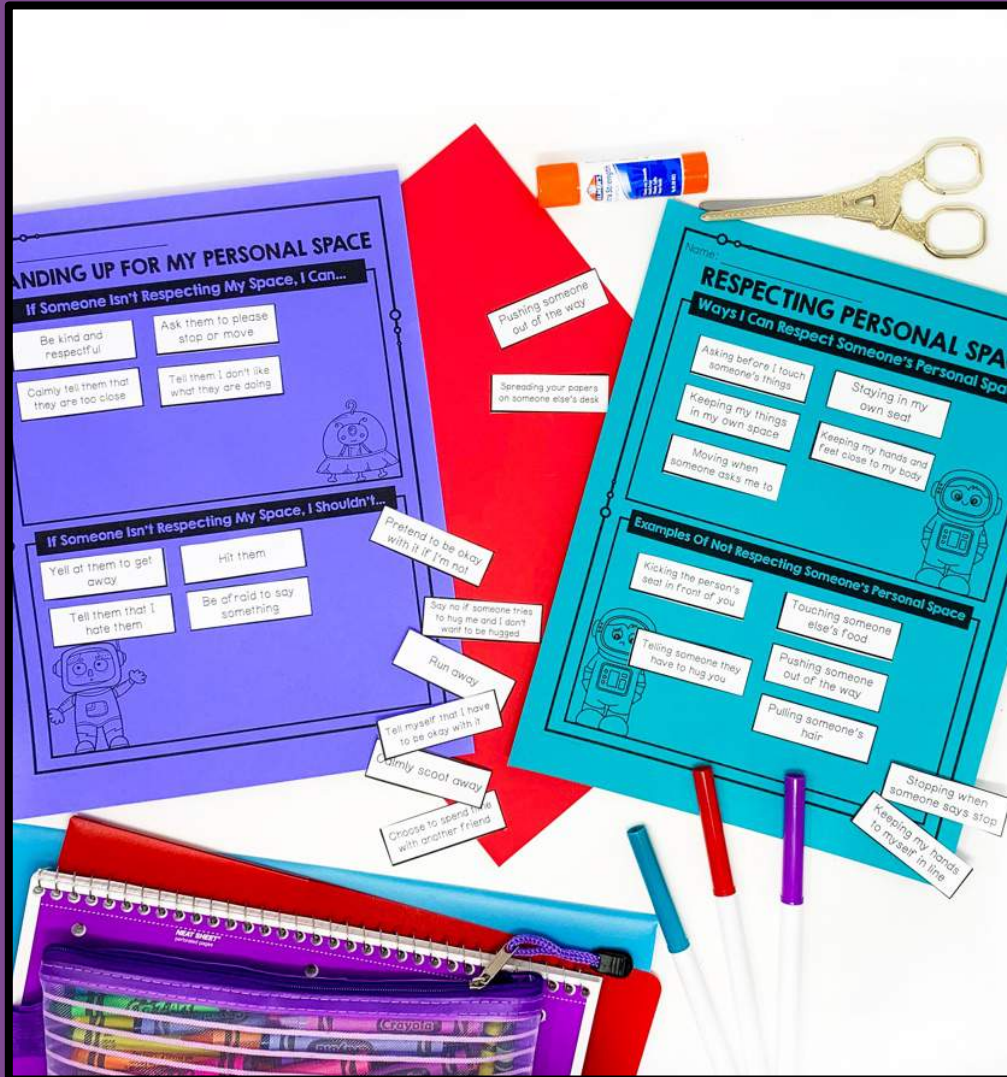

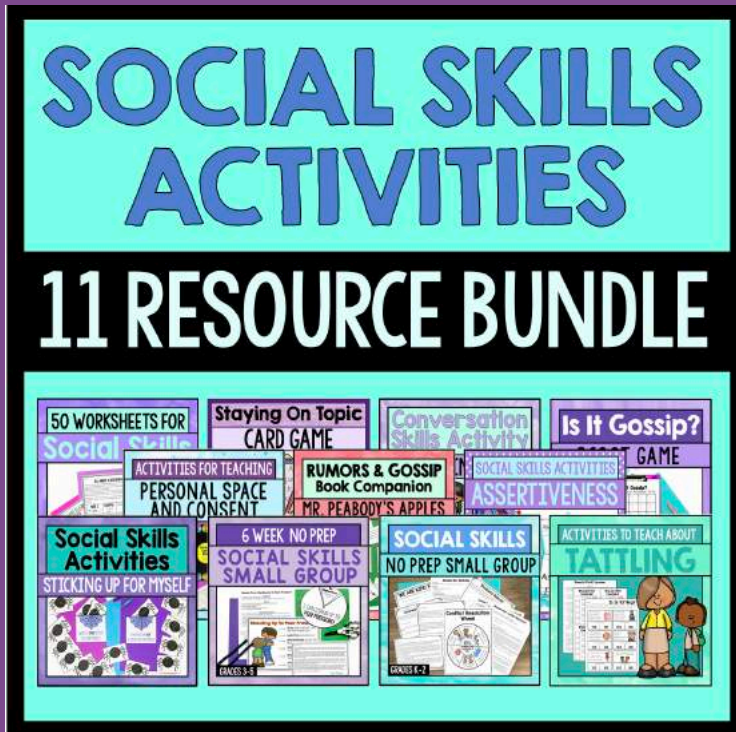
Students will reflect on what they are comfortable with when it comes to personal space.
