

Why Should I Use Scoot Games?

- Scoot games allow students to get up and moving while they learn!
- Use the answer key to quickly gauge student knowledge – before or after they learn about the topic.
- Students will look at different scenarios, and see how the topic presents itself in various ways.

How Do I Use Scoot Games?

- Cut out each of the 30 question cards, and post them throughout the room.
- Each student will receive a grid, and travel from spot to spot answering the question at their spot and recording it in the corresponding block.
- After about 30 seconds, the teacher will yell “SCOOT!” which means that the kids move on to the next spot.
- This game is intended to be fast-paced to keep kids moving and interested!
- After the kids finish each station, you can review the answers as a large group, or they can turn in their papers so that you can get a better idea of their understanding!

Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#9 Diamond tells all of her friends not to talk to Valentina because she doesn't like the same music they like. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#10 Lauren and Adam were arguing about who got to go first on the playground. They both were mean. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#17 Preston and Jadon started shoving each other because they both wanted to sit in the front seat of the car. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#18 Anytime Nora acts up, her friends encourage her to do things that are mean. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>
<p>#11 Raj took Jamin's candy without asking. When Raj got mad, Jamin apologized. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#12 Tamara and Millie don't like each other. They never seem to get along, so they don't spend much time together. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#23 When Kira talks, Addie talks at the same time so that no one can hear Kira. She does this to be mean. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#24 Dana stepped on Michael's shoe, so Michael started yelling at her. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#19 Estelle invited all of the girls in her class to her birthday party except for one. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#28 Anytime Mary posts a picture on social media, Riley leaves a mean comment. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>
				<p>#27 Finn pulled Izabelle's hair when she was sitting in front of him. Once she told him to stop, he did. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	
				<p>#29 Theo has broken some of Virginia's things on purpose. Theo tells Virginia to lie about it to her parents and say that she accidentally broke them herself. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?</p>	<p>#30 Suri and Shawn argue every day about who gets to sit in the bean bag chair. Is this bullying, conflict, or a mean moment?</p>

Students will travel throughout the room looking at the scenarios and deciding whether they are examples of conflict, bullying, or a mean moment.
