

Expected Or Unexpected? Cut and Paste


Students will learn the difference between expected and unexpected behaviors. They will look at 16 behaviors and decide if they are expected behaviors, or unexpected behaviors.

Expected or Unexpected?

EXPECTED BEHAVIORS

You put the class materials back when you are done.	You ask before you borrow your friend's pencil.
You are quiet in the library.	You sit at your desk during the lesson.
You answer the question when the teacher calls on you.	You are quiet during a movie.
You stand in line at the drinking fountain.	You sit in your seat on the bus.



UNEXPECTED BEHAVIORS



You steal from your friends.	You throw your food at lunch.
You fall asleep in class.	You yell out in the middle of class.
You run in the hallway.	You call your teacher mean names.
You raise your hand when you want to tell your mom something.	You only speak in a whisper voice.

What's Expected With Whom? Cut and Paste


Students will understand that what is expected will depend on who they are with. They will look at 15 behaviors and decide if they are expected with friends, with teachers, or with both.

What's Expected With Whom?

EXPECTED WITH FRIENDS

You go to that person's birthday party.	You play with the person at recess.
You ask the person to spend time with you on the weekends.	You play video games with this person.
You ask the person for their cell phone number.	




EXPECTED WITH TEACHERS AND FRIENDS

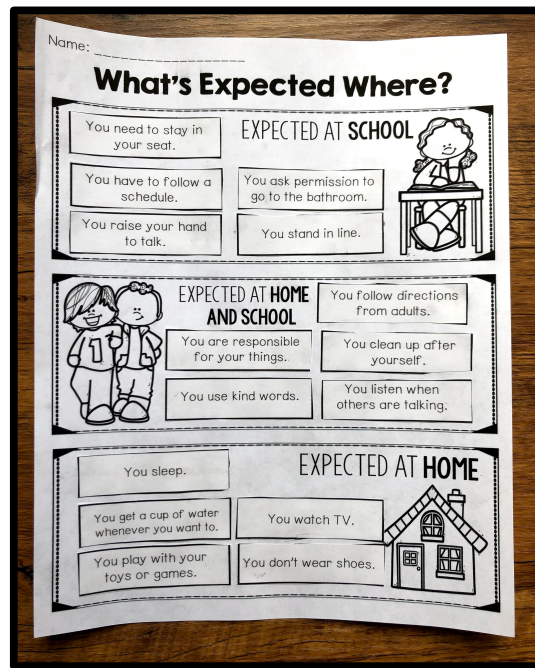


You use respectful words with this person.	
You are honest with this person.	You respect this person's personal space.
You don't touch this person's things without asking.	You listen while this person talks.

EXPECTED WITH TEACHERS

You call the person by their last name.	You have to follow this person's rules.
You raise your hand to talk to the person.	You let this person tell you what to do.
You ask the person if you can go to the bathroom.	



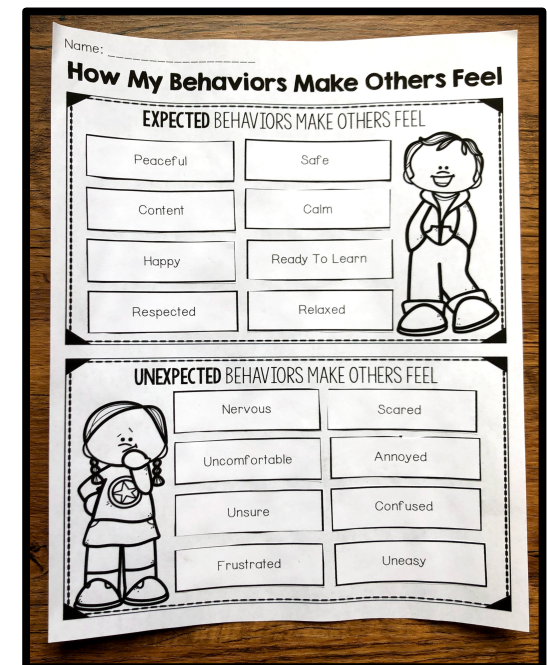


What's Expected Where? Cut and Paste

How My Behaviors Make Others Feel Cut and Paste

Students will understand that their behaviors affect the feelings of others. They will look at 16 feelings and decide whether they would be caused by expected or unexpected behaviors.

My Behaviors Affect How Others View Me

WHEN I HAVE EXPECTED BEHAVIORS, PEOPLE MAY...	WHEN I HAVE UNEXPECTED BEHAVIORS, PEOPLE MAY...
Think I am a good person.	Think I am weird.
Trust me.	Avoid me.
Want to sit next to me.	Be afraid to talk to me.
Want to be around me.	Not ask me to spend time with them.
Choose me to be on their team.	Be afraid of me.
Feel comfortable around me.	Not like me.
Feel safe around me.	Be annoyed by me.
Want to talk to me.	Not want to sit with me.

My Behaviors Affect How Others View Me

Cut and Paste

Students will understand that that their behaviors affect how others view/treat them. They will look at 16 examples and decide if they are caused by expected behaviors or unexpected behaviors.

These activities are perfect for:

- Social skills lessons or small groups.
- Positive behavior lessons or small groups.
- Students who could benefit from increasing their socially acceptable behaviors.
- Students who could benefit from considering how their behaviors affect the feelings of others.
- Individual, small group or classroom lessons

Why use cut & paste activities:

- Cut and paste activities are an **easy, no-prep** addition to any lesson!
- They are a great way to introduce a subject, or to gauge how well your students understand a certain topic.
- Cut and paste activities allow students to sort information in a way that makes sense and helps them to remember.
- Students will learn about topics by looking at scenarios they experience in real life.
