





 Diamond tells all of her friends not to talk to Valentina because she doesn't like the same music they like. Is this bullying, conflict or a mean moment?




OH YEAH!

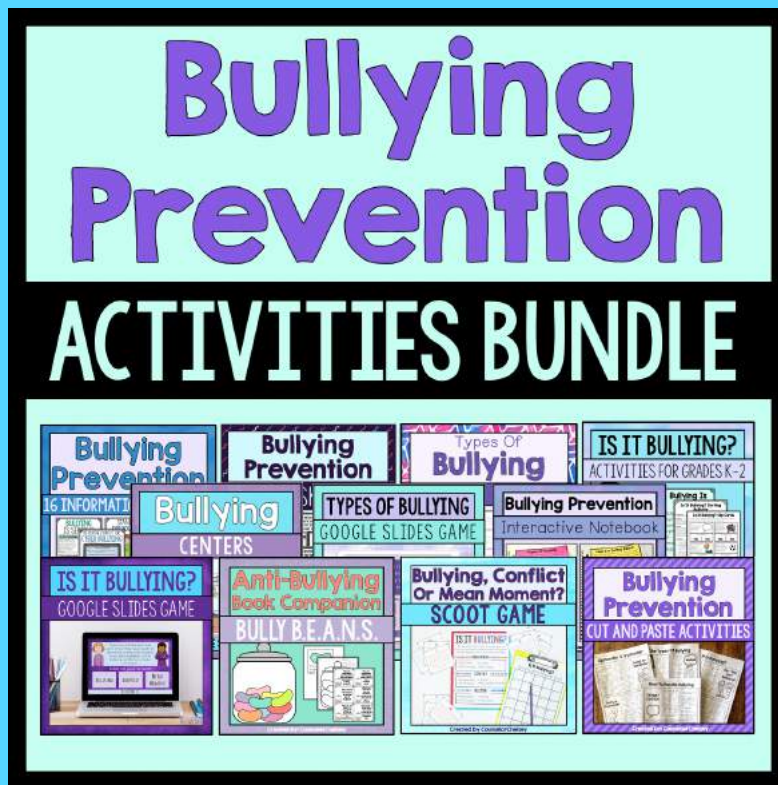
