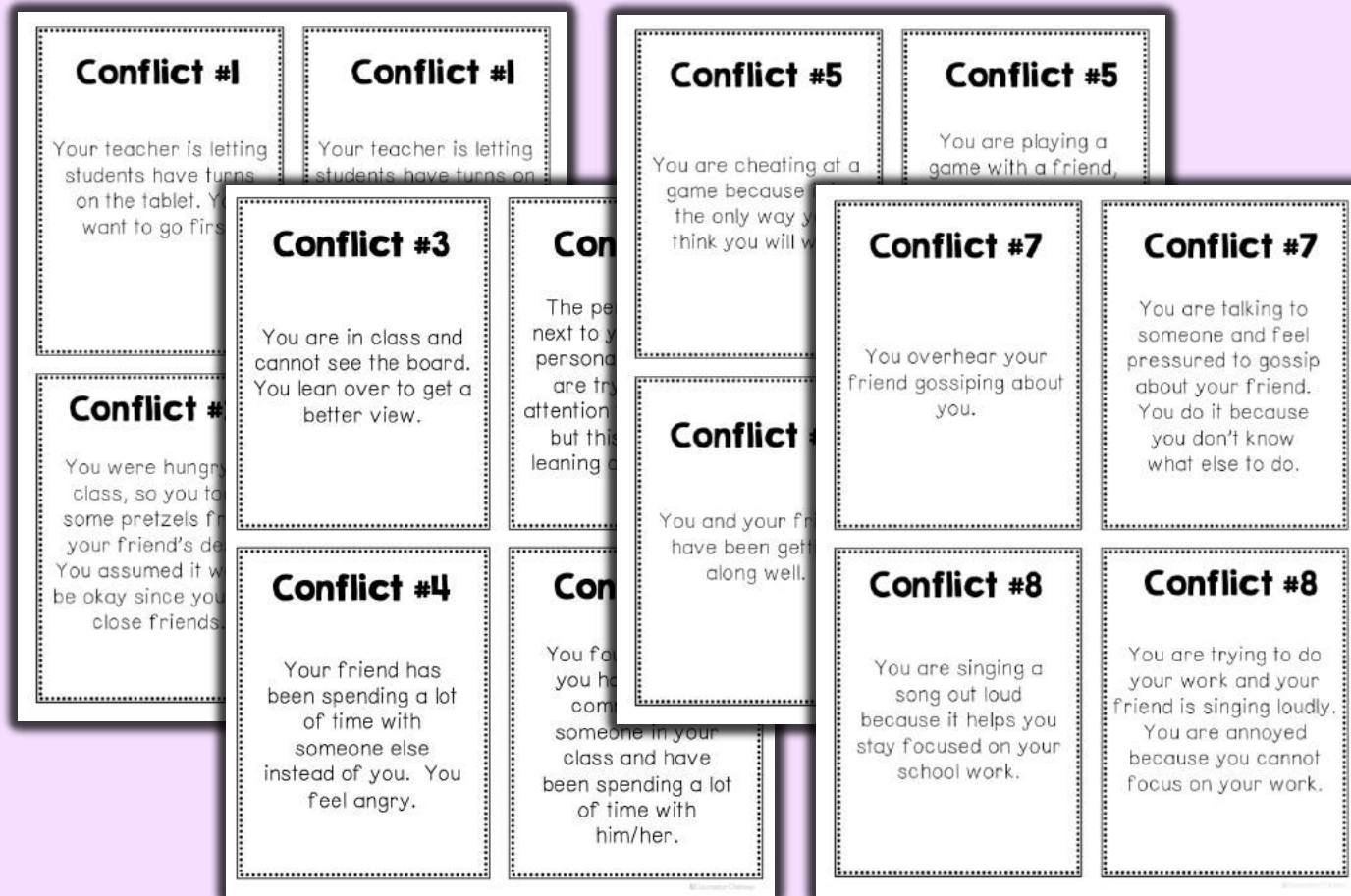


# Students will pair up and travel through 8 stations, acting out a conflict and seeking to resolve it!

### Conflict Resolution Steps

**Step 1: Make Sure You Are Calm**  
In order to better solve conflict, everyone is calm! When you are hard to think clearly and make decisions, you are not in a good position to solve the problem.

**Step 2: Identify The Problem**  
It is important to have a clear idea of what the problem is.

**Step 3: Decide If It Is A Big Problem**  
A big problem is anything that you cannot solve on your own with and that needs to be fixed immediately. Find an adult immediately to help you through step four.

**Step 4: Try Two Ways Of Solving The Problem**  
Try at least two strategies such as: using an I-Statement, taking turns, compromising, ignoring it, asking the person to stop, or finding something else to do.

**Step 5: Tell An Adult If Necessary**  
If it is a big problem, or you have gone through all of the steps, it may be a good idea to get an adult involved. Adults you can talk to include your teacher, principal, parents, neighbors, babysitters, etc.

### Conflict Resolution

#### Who, What, When, Where, Why

**What is it?**  
The ability to solve disagreements in a way that is healthy and respectful of everyone involved.

**Who uses conflict resolution?**  
Everyone! It is very normal for people to have disagreements, and anyone can learn the skills to solve them in a positive way.

**When should you use conflict resolution?**  
It is best to try to solve problems when everyone is calm and ready to listen to what others have to say.

**Where should you use conflict resolution?**  
It is best to solve conflicts in a private space where no one is at risk of being embarrassed in front of friends or family.

**Why should we resolve conflicts peacefully?**  
Conflict can be hard to handle, but it is important that everyone is treated with dignity and respect. Resolving conflicts peacefully is very important for maintaining friendships!

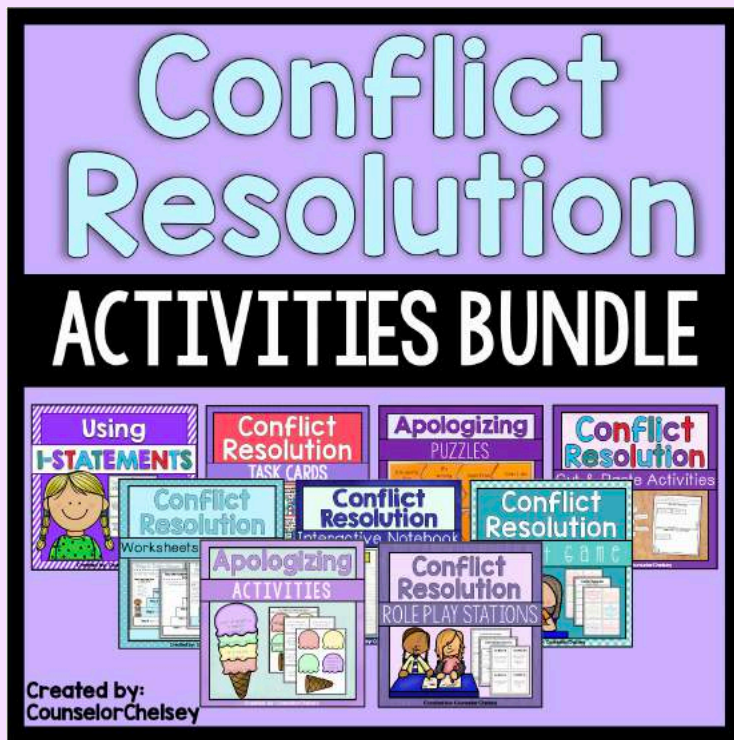
