


Use these activities to teach your students what a 4 part apology is and how to use it!

You can also use this as a visual aid during the rest of the activities in this resource.


"PRACTIVING AN APOLOGY" ACTIVITY



Students will look at 16 scenarios and practice forming a four part apology using the ice cream cone template.


For repeated use, you can laminate the cones and have students use dry erase markers. Students can then erase and repeat for each scenario card!


