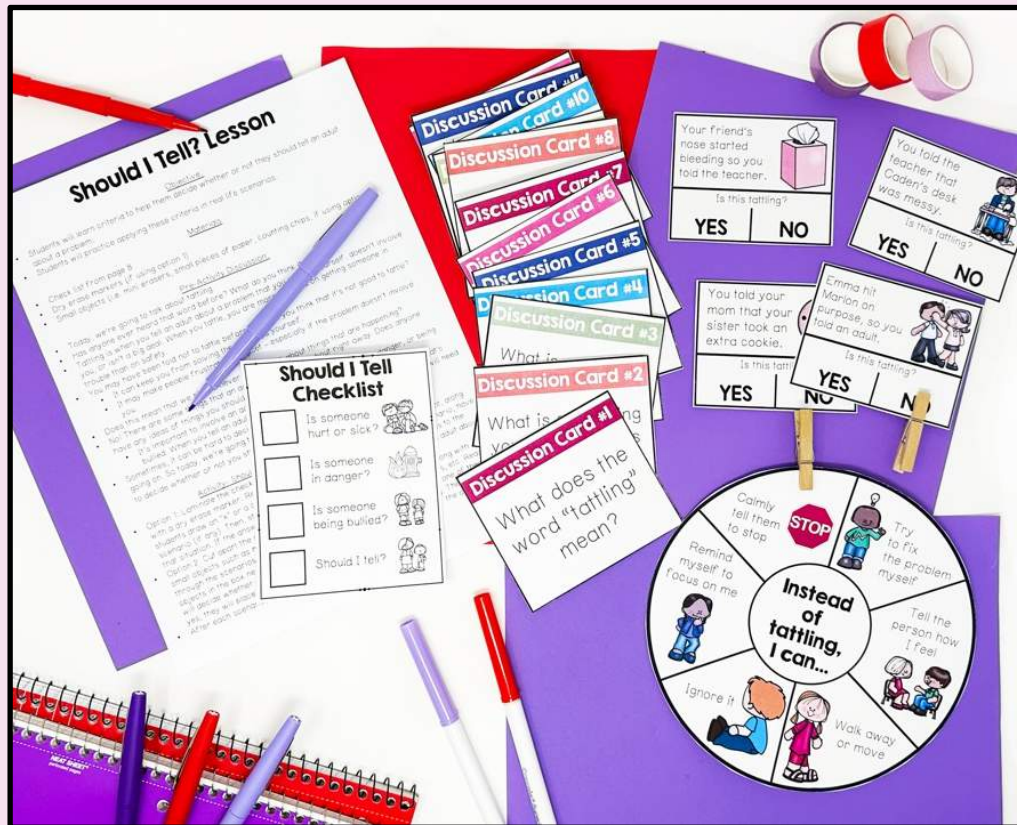


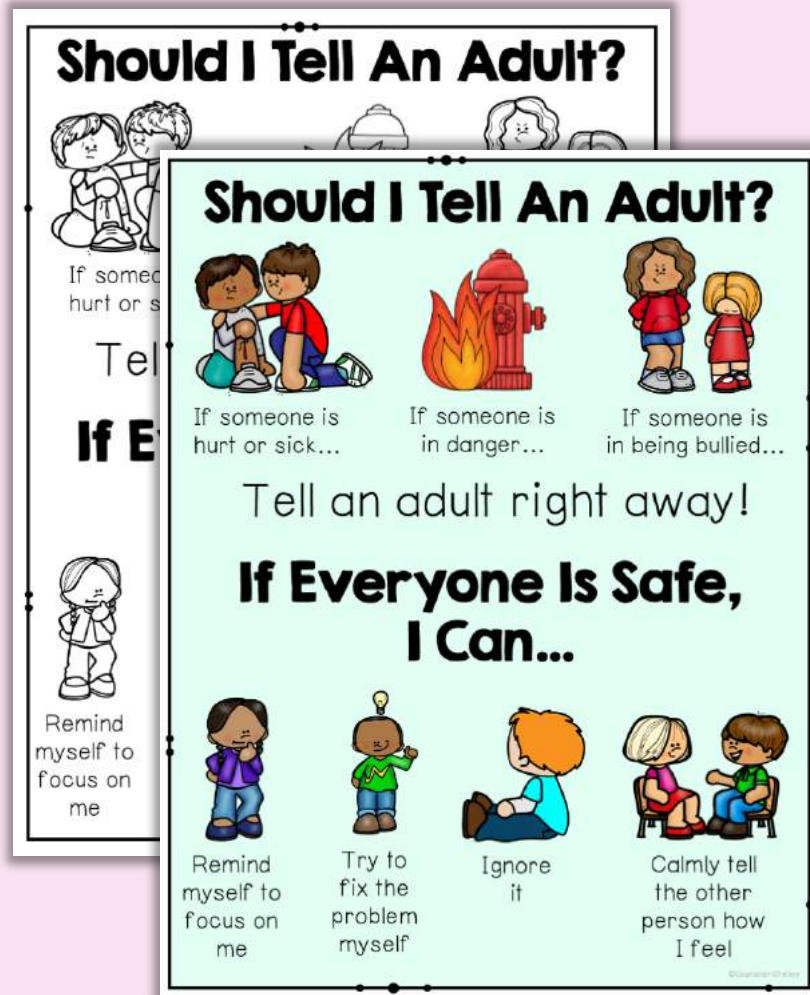
Use these activities to help students learn when it's okay to tell an adult, and what they can do instead of tattling.

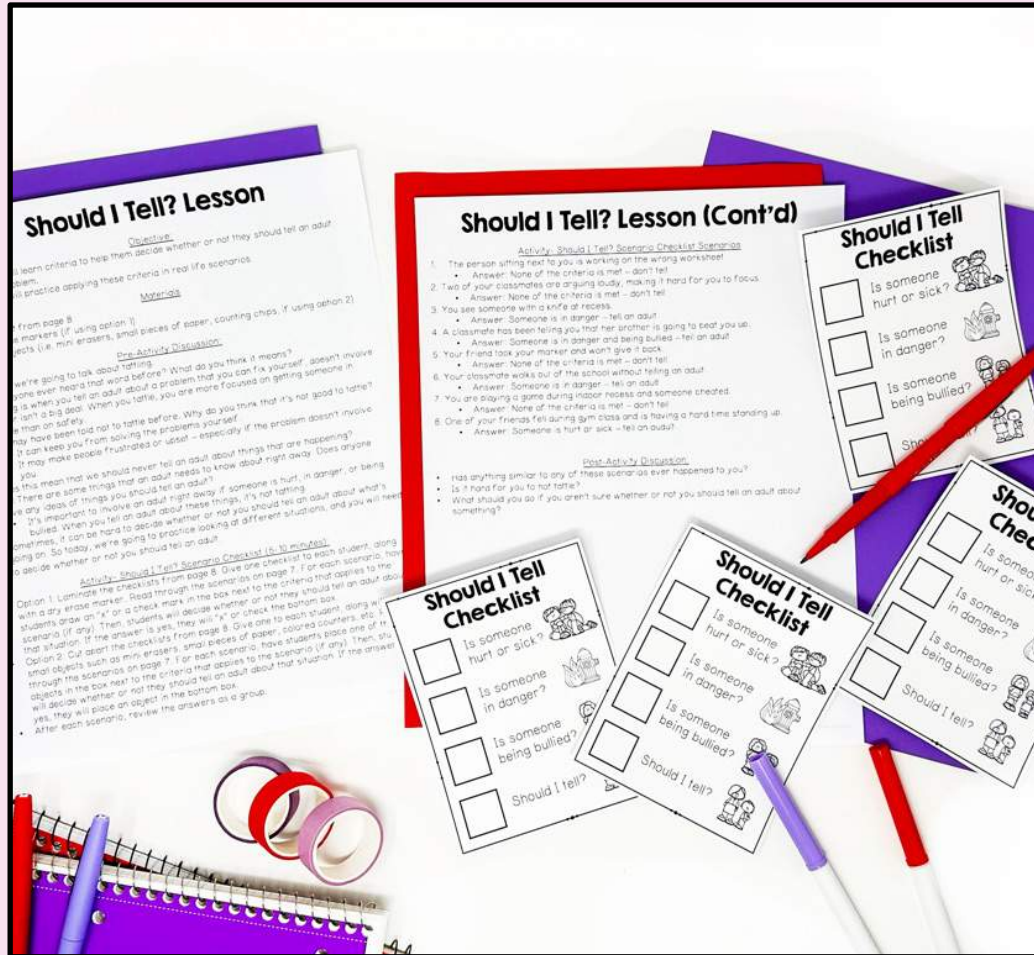

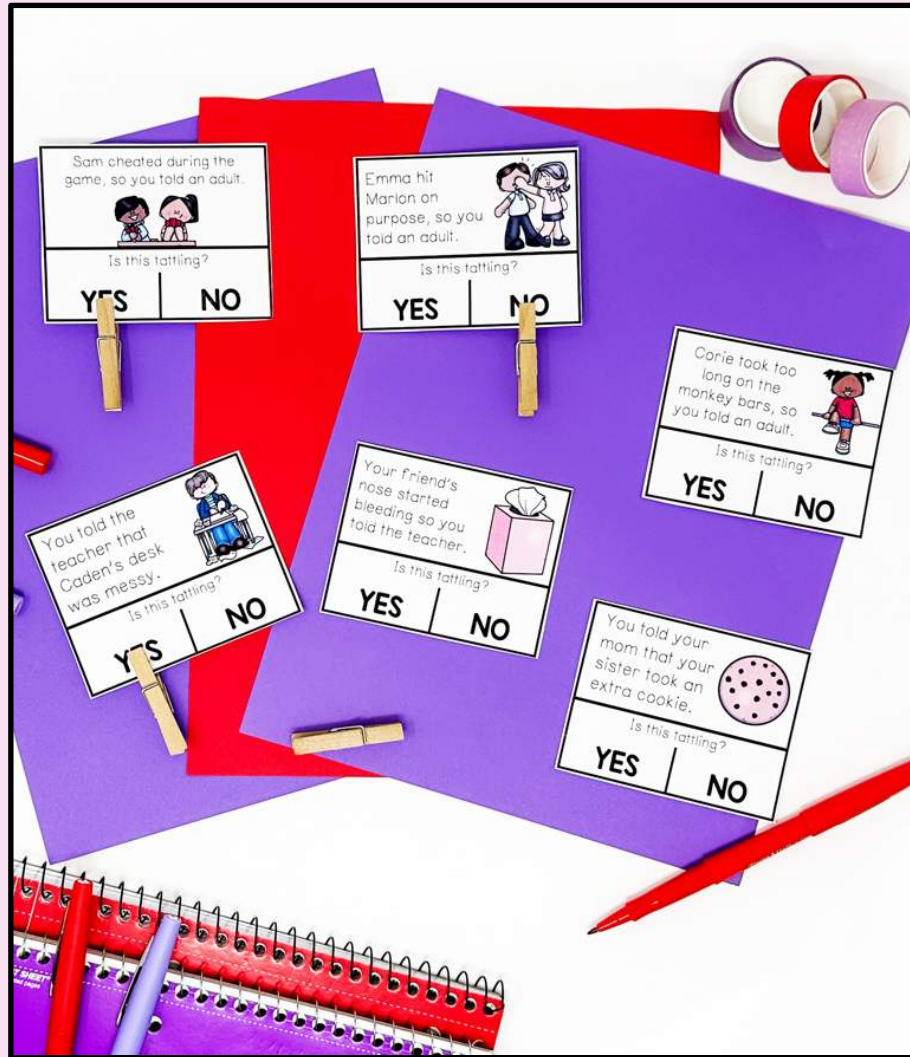
This poster can be used as a visual aid for the activities in this resource, or displayed in your classroom or office!

Use this scripted lesson to help kids learn when they should tell an adult about a problem.

“INSTEAD OF TATTLING” ACTIVITY

**“Instead Of Tattling”
Scenarios**

Directions: Give a wheel from page 16 or 17 to each student. Read the following scenarios to your students. Students will look at their wheel and decide what they can do instead of tattling in each situation. Students can share their answers out loud, or point to the answer they chose. Students can also cut their wheels out and attach a clothespin to the section of the wheel that corresponds with their answer.

1. Your friend took your seat.
2. You see someone running in the hallway.
3. Someone accidentally bumped into you.
4. Your classmate is speaking loudly during silent reading.
5. Your friend won't give you the ball when it's your turn to have it.
6. Your classmate drew on your desk.
7. Your friend won't help you.
8. Your classmate is talking to someone else.
9. Your classmate is talking to someone else.
10. Your friend...

Instead of tattling, I can...

- Calmly tell them to stop
- Try to fix the problem myself
- Tell the person how I feel
- Walk away or move
- Ignore it
- Remind myself to focus on me

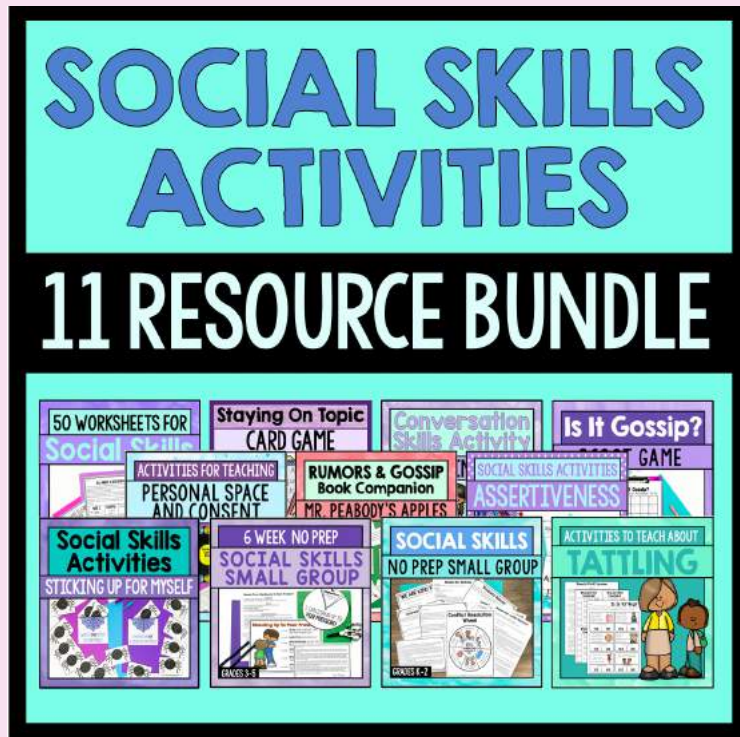
Kids will learn about things that they can do instead of tattling. They will look at 10 scenarios and decide which strategy would be best in that situation.
